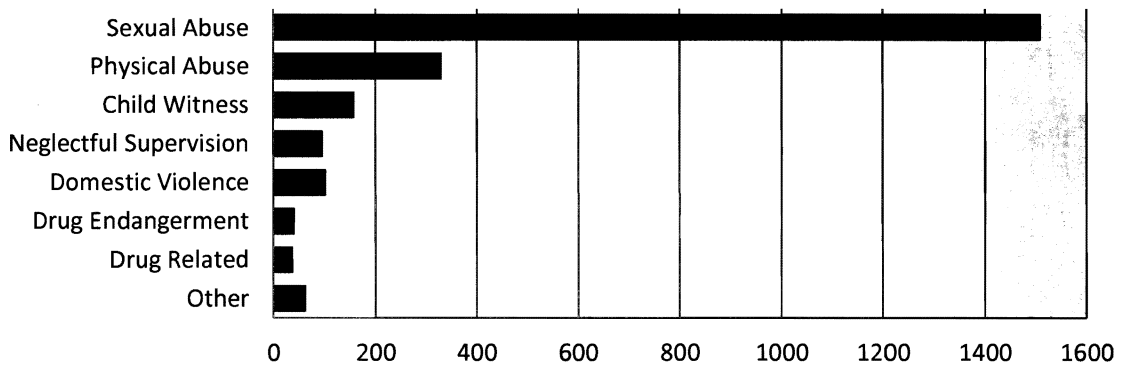




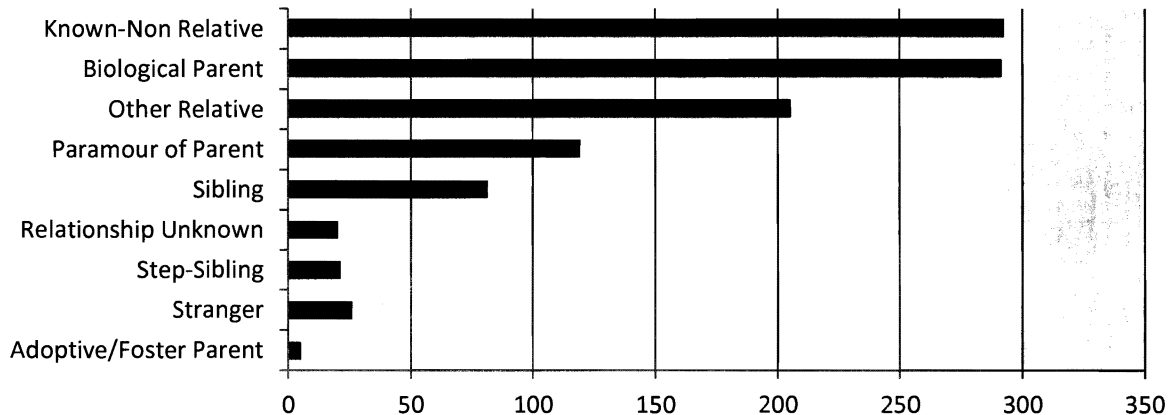
FY 11-12 FAMILY PROTECTION Fee Report

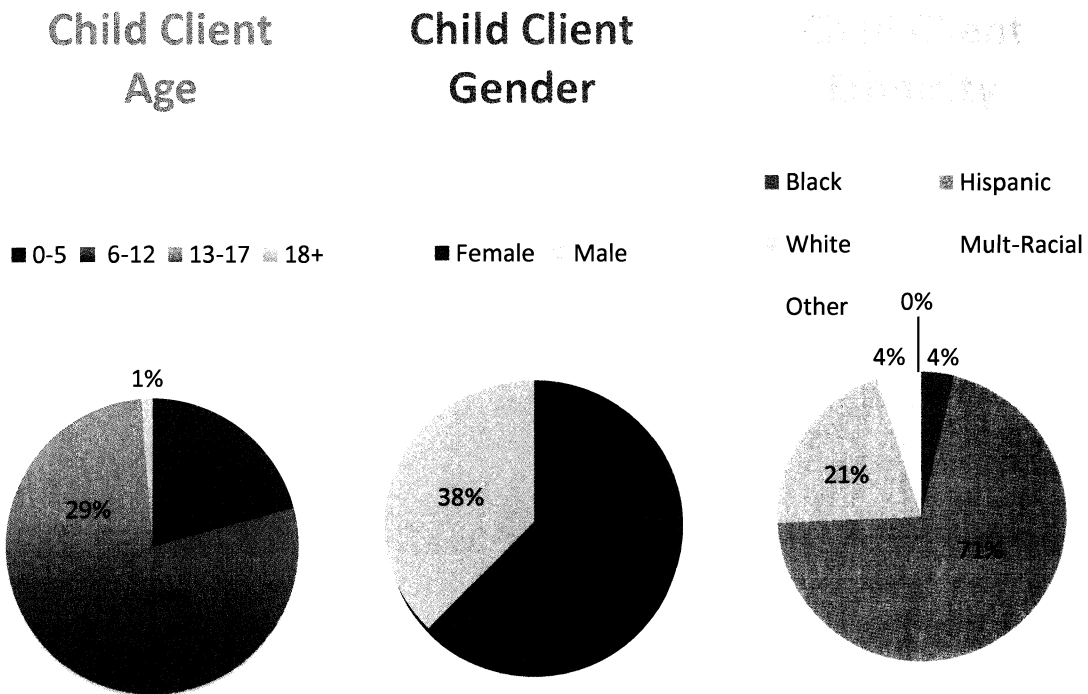
## Of The Total Number of Children seen last year,

1,100 were involved in Sexual Abuse Cases.

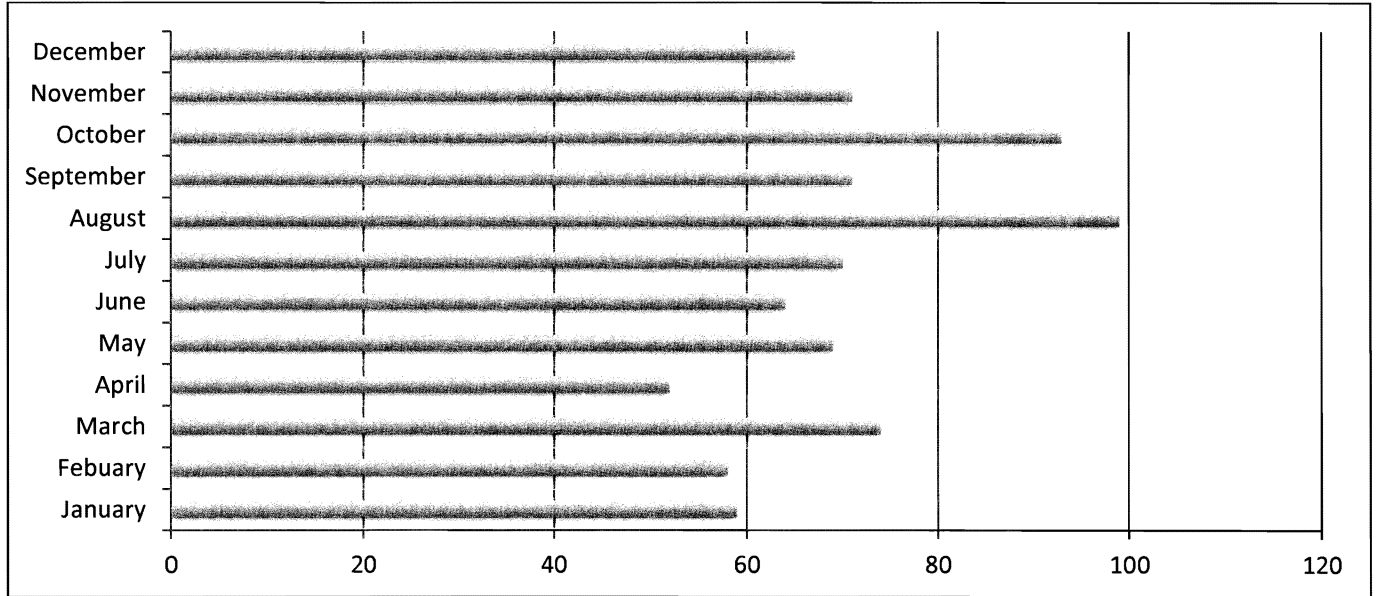
## In 2012, The CACCB conducted 1,857 forensic interviews.



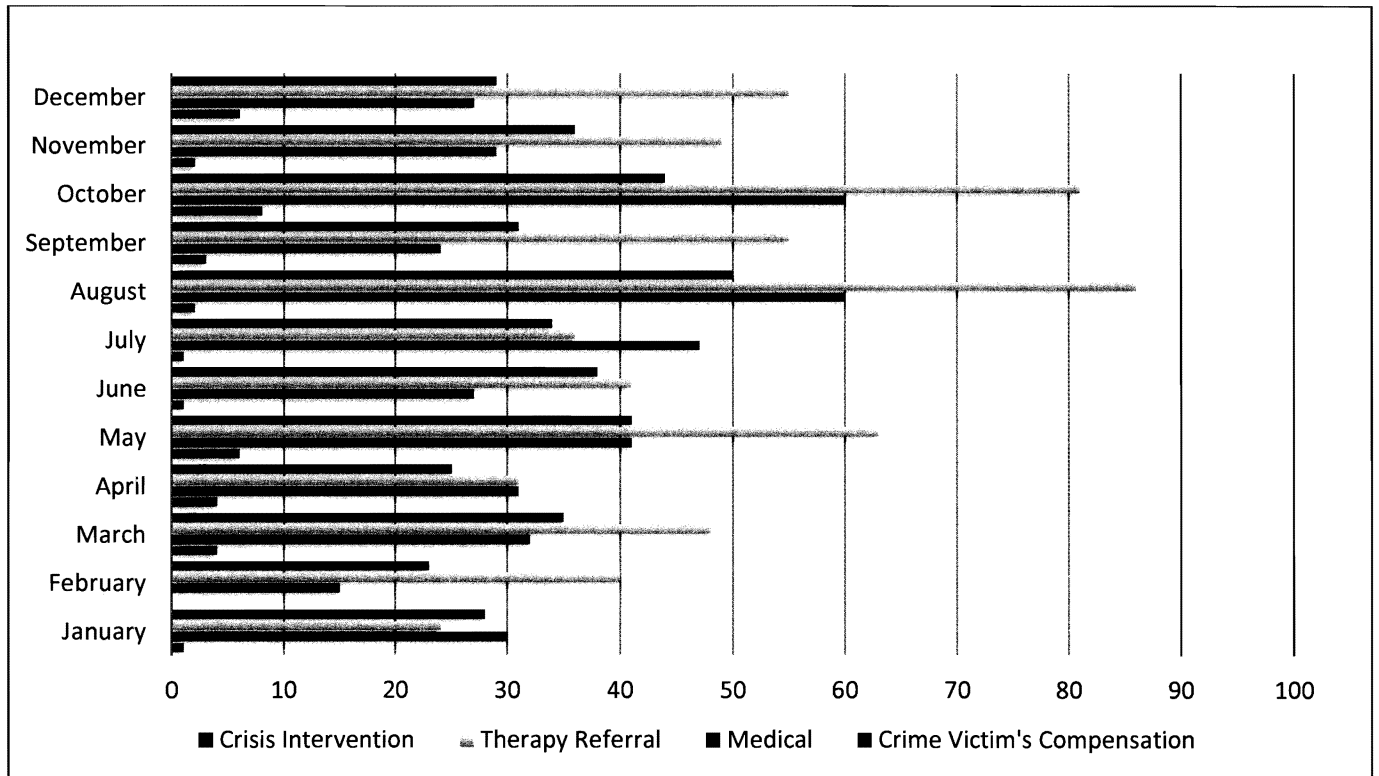
The CACCB collaborates with public agencies charged with investigating, prosecuting, and treating child victims. The partner agencies include The Texas Department of Family and Protective Services, Corpus Christi Police Department, Driscoll Children’s Hospital, Nueces County District Attorney’s Office, Nueces County Sheriff’s Office, and many therapist offices. The CAC provides courtesy services to counties in the Coastal Bend including Kleberg, Kenedy, Brooks, Refugio, McMullen, San Patricio, Aransas, Bee, Live Oak, Jim Wells, and Duval.

**In 2012, The CACCB served 845 families and provided 7,574 services.**

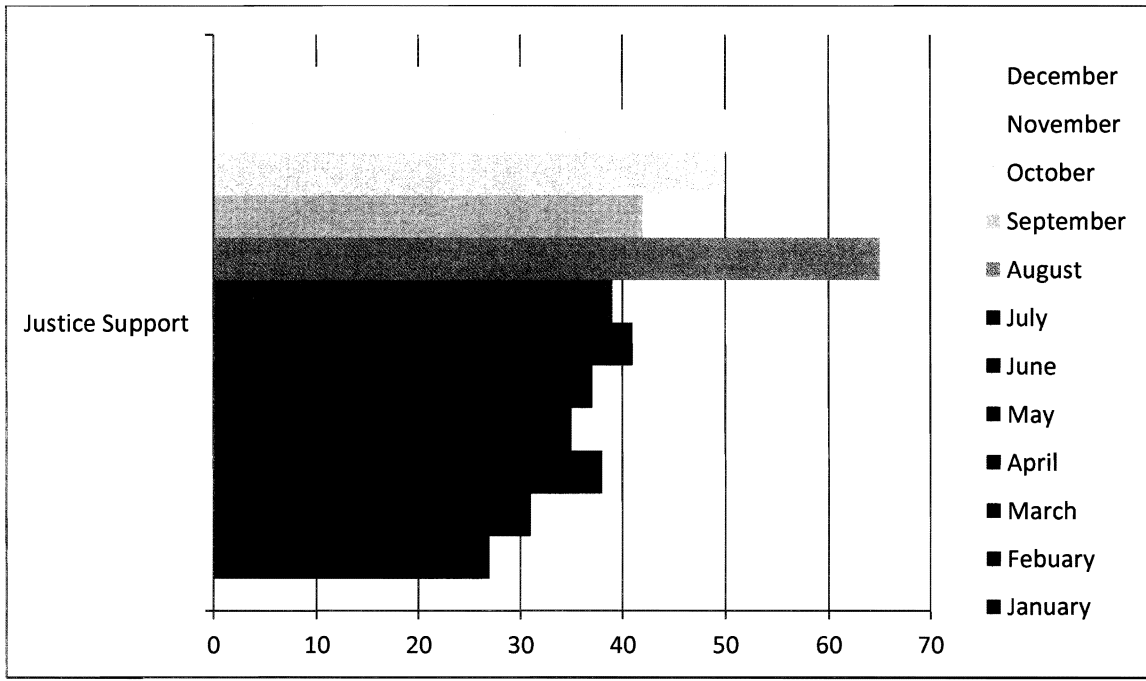
**Families Served**



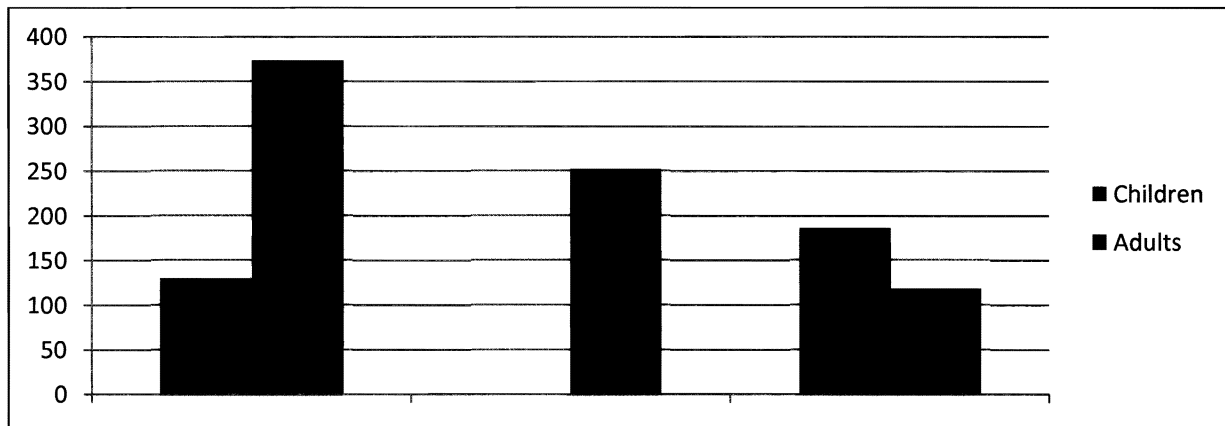
**Services Provided**
